Phones and Digital devices are now a part of young peoples

■ Southbridge recognizes that mobile phones and digital devices are now a part of young peoples' culture and way of life and can have considerable value, particularly in relation to individual safety.

It is recognized that such technology will play an increasing part in future learning practices, but, like existing ICT use, this should follow agreed rules and guidelines to prevent disruption and instill good learning habits.

The school therefore accepts that pupils are permitted to bring mobile phones and digital devices to school but that their use is subject to the following guidelines.

- 1. Students must ensure that files stored on their phones do not contain violent, degrading or offensive images.
- 2. Cyber-bullying is completely unacceptable, and will be followed up by the school as serious misbehavior which the school, in turn, will invoke the necessary sanctions as laid out in the school's code of conduct.
- 3. Southbridge expects that phones will be switched off and kept in lockers during the course of the school day, including break-time and lunchtime, so as to avoid disrupting teaching and learning and a breach of data and child

Students who break this rule will have their phone confiscated and in the first instance returned at the end of the day. A further issue will involve parents collecting the device.
