Parent Orientation and Conversation Afternoons

I am excited about the 2024-2025 school year in the SISC Secondary School, a year when students have more choices and clearer academic pathways than ever. On August 20th, we held a Parent Orientation to give an overview of the secondary school academic programs as well as receive feedback and questions from parents.

One of the most important topics was how we have fully implemented the new Integrated Curriculum in grades 6-10. The students are already feeling the benefits of the IC: it has reduced their workload and given them more time during the school day to get support from their teachers as well as supervised self-study time to review and prepare for tests and other assessments during the school day. This reduces psychological, emotional, and physical stress, decreases the pressure of homework after school, and hopefully will give your child a little more family time at home.

Technology in education is an important part of 21st century schools, including the use of technology for learning activities and research. Another big part of educational technology is a school's Learning Management System. At SISC, our main platform for Learning Management is Managebac, where we record and track classroom attendance, scores on assessments, and generate report cards, to name just a few things.





On September 12 we invited parents to our monthly Parent Conversation Afternoon where we helped parents understand how they can use Managebac: how to login, recover their password, and what they can learn from the information on Managebac. Parents learned how to find their children's Managebac profiles and look at their progress in their various subjects, access report cards, and read behavior notes. Parents also learned about accessing their child's timetable and other features. This introduction will be followed soon by further exploration of how parents can use Managebac as well as an introduction to Google Classroom, our other important management tool in the Secondary School.
