Our young explorers embarked on an exciting journey through space in our IRYC unit titled "Blast Off!" Students became little astronauts, scientists, and artists as they dove into the wonders of the solar system — and what an adventure it has been!

From the fiery surface of the Sun to the icy edges of Neptune, our space-themed activities sparked curiosity, creativity, and a whole lot of fun. The classroom was transformed into a mini-universe, filled with colorful creations and out-of-this-world imagination.

Students used their artistic talents to bring the solar system to life. They crafted:

1. Sparkling stars and constellations using glitter, string, and dark construction paper.
2. Astronaut helmets and space suits made from recycled materials, perfect for imaginative play.
3. Rocket ships, satellites, and space stations are designed with incredible detail and creativity.
4. Collage planets using diverse materials, including colored rice, kinetic sand, pom-poms, and sawdust from sharpened pencils.
5. Jetpacks made from plastic bottles, which the students decorated, increasing their creativity.
6. During a treasure hunt around the playground, "Moon Rocks" were discovered scattered on the ground. The students used their imaginations with different-shaped stones, and they were later used to compare sizes and weights.
7. Galaxy spirals were created using pastel colours and a smudging technique to enhance the swirling effect.



Through these hands-on activities, students not only learned about planets, moons, and stars — they also practiced teamwork, storytelling, and critical thinking. Discussions about gravity, orbits, and space travel sparked big questions and even bigger dreams.

After a well-managed qualifying round, the players will compete in the final stages at the beginning of May. They have shown great determination and commitment throughout their preparation.


This is a team that truly gets along — the players demonstrate strong team spirit and solidarity. Individual talents are put at the service of the group, which gives its best in every match.
