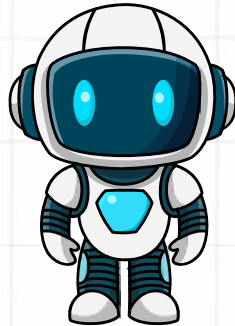


AI Robotics Farm
